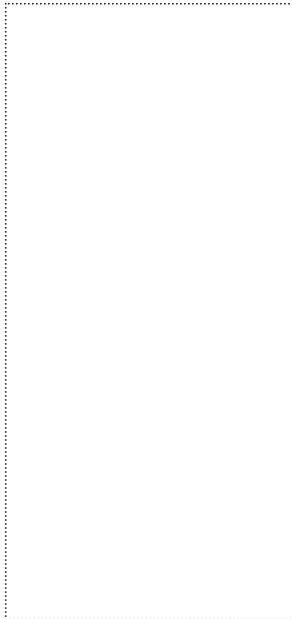

- ✓ All horses should be properly vaccinated for your own protection.
- ✓ The State Veterinarian recommends that your horse be given an **EEE Shot** (Eastern Equine Encephalitis).
- ✓ All horses must have a negative **Coggins test** within 12 months of the show date. The negative Coggins test certificate must be brought to the show to be kept on file. **May be mailed emailed or faxed to save time on day of show. Fax to 860-345-3357 attention Emily Alger**
- ✓ All horses shall have a **rabies vaccination** administered by a veterinarian within 12 months and at least 30 days prior to the show date. A vaccination certificate signed by the veterinarian that gave the vaccination indicating the name of the vaccine and serial number must be presented. **May be mailed, emailed or faxed to save time on day of show. Fax to 860-345-3357 attention Emily Alger**
- ✓ All exhibitors **must** bring the certificates with them to show to the secretaries. If you do not bring them with you, *you will not be allowed to show.*

Horse Show Rules



Age Divisions: Beginners are limited to those riders who have never shown at a canter. Any age excluding beginner riders are eligible for open classes. Rider's age will be considered the same as it was on January 1 of this year (Juniors are age 7 to 13, seniors age 14 to 18). Beginner riders must ride in the Beginner division. Junior and Senior divisions are based solely on the age of the rider, not on ability of horse and/or rider. Any questions as to division qualifications should be directed to a Horse Show Coordinator prior to the show.

Entry Fees: \$8.00 per class (Fitting & Showmanship free to 4-H members showing card). Middlesex and New Haven County 4-H members who have turned in a 2010 4-H Horse project verification form and exhibited their 2010 4-H record book at the fair are eligible for one free Division. The Division will consist of Equitation, Pleasure, Trail, or a Gymkhana Division (beginner, junior or senior) or Driving division, Pleasure driving, Reinsmanship, & Obstacle driving. Entry fees to be *reimbursed at County Awards pending verification of proper paperwork*. A class requiring 2 riders requires 2 entry fees and 2 numbers. A post entry fee of \$20.00 per rider will be charged after 9:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 9, 2010. Minors must have a signature of a parent or guardian. Entries must be paid before entering the ring.

Classes: The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to combine, divide, or change any class. No class will be held for late arrivals. **Green Horse is judged on the horse not the rider. Horse must be in its 1st or 2nd year of showing. Green Horses may not enter any other under saddle class.** The New England 4-H Horse Show Rule Book will govern the shows unless otherwise stated. Classes will be held no longer than three minutes after final call. **Money will be refunded at the discretion of the Horse Show Committee. No holds for cross entry - no refunds for missed classes due to cross entry.**

Personal Safety: *AHSA/SEI APPROVED AND PROPERLY FITTED HARD HATS WITH HARNESSSES* are required for all people mounted or driving 19 yrs. and under. As positive role models, we encourage all adult participants to wear appropriate safety gear. Chaps are *not* allowed in any Equitation Class. Gymkhana attire: jeans and tee shirts are permitted. *PROPER RIDING BOOTS MUST BE WORN IN ALL CLASSES* by all riders. Martingales are permitted in fence and Gymkhana Classes only.

Riding Areas: The Middlesex & New Haven County 4-H Fair and the Haddam Neck Fair Associations will not be responsible for injury to animals, persons, or damage to property of exhibitors or spectators. Horses are only allowed in designated areas. Horses are to be led or ridden or driven only at a walk in these areas. Any horse and rider or driver found outside the designated area or violating the above rule may be asked to leave and entry fees forfeited. There will be no riding permitted in the parking area or around the other areas of the fairgrounds. The ring will be available for warm-up before the show and during lunch break.

Safety Precautions: Safety precautions *must* be observed at all times. No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the fairgrounds. All horses known or suspected to be kickers must be identified by a red ribbon in the tail. Any persons risking injury to themselves, other exhibitors, spectators, or showing unnecessary roughness or being discourteous will be disqualified from further competition *with no refund*. The disqualified rider will not be eligible for awards. The Judge or Steward may excuse a horse or rider for unfitness, mistreatment, or health concerns. Decision of the judge is final. *No stallions are allowed.*

Reimbursement: Reimbursement for division classes for enrolled 4-H members and will only be given to Middlesex and New Haven County members who pre-register by 6/1/2010, submit 2010 record books at the Fair, 2010 4-H Horse Project verification forms **Record Books** must be turned into the 4-H Fair check-in office by Friday night of the 4-H Fair, 6:30 p.m.

Special 4-H Horse Show Classes

Class 5 Premier Showmanship Qualifier - Open to Middlesex & New Haven County 4-H members only who have received a blue danish in classes 1-4. First place winner in the qualifier must plan to return to the Fair Sunday August 8th at 8:00 am at the Fairgrounds in Durham for the Premier Showman Contest.

Class 11 Norman Sayers Memorial Pleasure Class - Sponsored by the Connecticut Horse Council. 4-H only, must show 4-H card. 4-H members must enter fitting and showmanship to be eligible. English and Western riders.

Class 12 Anthony Thaille Memorial Pleasure Class - Sponsored by the Middlesex County 4-H Horse Advisory Committee in memory of Tony Thaille who judged this and many other 4-H horse shows for many years. Rider must show 4-H card. 4-H members must enter fitting and showmanship to be eligible. English and Western riders.

Class 13 Eastern States Exposition Alumni and Staff Class – Sponsored by Russ & Carol Birdsey. Open to any rider who has participated in the 4-H program at the Eastern States Exposition, either as a delegate or as a staff member. English and Western riders. Judged as a Pleasure & Equitation Class.

Driving Classes

Classes 30 – Reinsmanship Driving - Judged on the skill of the driver and their communication with the horse. To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, jog trot, and working trot or alternate gaits. May be asked to rein back.

Class 31 - Pleasure Driving – Judged on the suitability of horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be shown at a walk, trot & extended trot both ways of the ring. Must stand quietly and back readily. An adult may ride as an attendant.

Class 32 – Obstacle Driving – To be driven as a performance class. To be driven at the trot over a prescribed course of obstacles. After passing through the starting line the competitor shall proceed through each obstacle to the designated finish line. Time will be used to break ties only. In the event of a tie a drive off will be required.

Dick Woolam Memorial Walk Trot Classic: In memory of a long time 4-H friend and leader who enjoyed well-behaved horses. This class will consist of a command and trail class to be held in the ring. Open to walk/trot riders only.

Dick Woolam Memorial Classic: In memory of a long time 4-H friend and leader This class will consist of a command and trail class to be held in the ring. Open to all riders except walk/trot.

Open English Discipline Class – To be shown at the walk/trot/canter . Judges may ask for any of the following commands: walk, extended walk, trot, extended trot, canter, hand gallop, side-pass, back along the rail, turn on the forehand, turn on the haunches, counter canter, stand, halt, reverse at any gait, or any other command as the judges deems fit.

Cross Rails: To be shown over a course of fences 18 inches in height at the walk/trot or walk/trot/canter – depending on rider’s ability level. **Riders may not enter any other fence classes.** Courses will be posted.

Costume Class: Judged on originality and creativeness of both rider and horse’s costumes. Horses may be ridden or led. Beginners welcome. Protective headgear rule applies, and must be worn if mounted, if 19 years of age and under. For safety reasons proper footwear must be worn.

Working Hunter Under Saddle Class: Judged both ways of the ring at the walk, trot and canter. Both manners and way of going are judging criteria. Horses may be asked to hand gallop, no more than 8 at a time. Horses may be asked to back and stand quietly.

Hunter Hack Class: Horse is shown on the flat and may be asked to jump 2 low fences, open a gate or perform individual tasks by the judge. Horses are required to perform at the walk, trot, canter and hand gallop.
